Since news of the storm first broke in the papers, Suffolk's newscasters are almost unable to fill the demands. The packages are hardly unwrapped before the sheets start going to the printers.

If you are seeking a well-planned cabin cruiser named "Fido, Pt. of Woods," you'll find it washed up on the beach near Sayville. The same thing goes for a black-painted cruiser, which along with the other arrived without operator or passenger in West Sayville Wednesday night.

Willie Myron Buys, Argus-Advance composing room foreman, was watching the waves wash over West Sayville's public dock about 10:30 p. m. Wednesday, a member of the group stepped down and picked up a small blackfish which was foundering in a large puddle.

First news of the storm's death toll at Westmont Beach reached Patchogue at 8:30 p. m. when two men of them under a terrific strain, arrived here seeking help in the search for bodies down east.

The visit, which resulted in Patchogue Legionnaires and State Troopers rushing to Westmont Beach, was made by Leonard Jarvis, aged 34, whose mother and father were killed in the storm. Jarvis, 25, their trip to Patchogue, made over back roads, required 75 miles.

The Long Island railroad was seriously affected by the fact that the westbound express that leaves Patchogue at 4:40 p. m. got in from the east yesterday at 3:10 and was still waiting on a siding a half hour later. The train finally arrived in New York at 8:30, after having made several unscheduled stops in order for the crew to remove huge trees that had fallen across the tracks during the storm.

The only entrance to the harbor, by automobile for several hours after the storm was by way of Station Road. Brookhaven boulevard, then through New Jersey avenue. Once inside the village, traveling was difficult. The storm brought out such a variety of unusual sounds, such as the sound of a car being pushed, or four sections of the large billboard opposite Patchogue station, which was blown like a window shade rolling up.
